



Instrumental and Vocal Lessons 2018

Dear Parents

All students at St Matthew's will be encouraged to develop their musical talents by participation in choir, orchestra, ensemble groups and a variety of other cultural activities.

We are extremely fortunate to offer a good range of instrumental and vocal tuition from our team of experienced itinerant teachers who are expert practising musicians in their own right. Lessons are held throughout the school day and girls are released from class to attend these lessons, however it is important for them catch up on work missed. We encourage all new girls to learn an instrument or singing at school. Instrumentalists are highly sought after in school events such as the annual House Music Competition, where they can use their skills to good advantage accompanying their house on the piano or playing as a member of a band.

We would like girls who are learning singing to be in the choir as this builds on the work done in singing lessons and reinforces reading notation.

Girls who are learning the clarinet, flute, saxophone or violin are encouraged to join the orchestra when they have been learning for a term. It is an excellent way to develop their reading and ensemble skills. The orchestra plays in key school events such as Prizegiving and Carol Service. Wind instruments may be hired at reasonable cost through KBB music.

Girls who are learning the guitar, bass or drums will be encouraged to join the jazz band when they are ready

Please note that girls who wish to learn piano must have access to a piano or keyboard at home on which to practise. Girls must buy a guitar if they enrol in guitar lessons and provide their own picks and capo if required.

Itinerant Instrumental and Vocal Teachers for next year:

- ◆ **Ms Marguerite Tait-Jamieson** (singing). BA (Mus), registered singing teacher (NZATS), President of the Hutt Valley Competitions Society, vocal convener of the Dame Malvina Major Wellington Aria. Marguerite teaches at three Wairarapa colleges and is the director of the St Matthew's Junior Choir.
- ◆ **Ms Kate Marshall** (piano & flute) is a pianist with international training and experience. She is also a violinist and flautist in local bands.
- ◆ **Mr Tonnie ten Hove** teaches guitar and bass. He is a local musician who went from Wairarapa College to study performance and composition at Victoria University, gaining a B Mus in composition. He teaches guitar at 5 local schools as well as writing, performing and composing music for his band Pencarrow which has just released its first album.
- ◆ **Mrs Ruth Eckford** (clarinet & saxophone) is a pianist, accompanist, conductor and teacher in the Masterton area. She conducts the Wairarapa Youth Concert Band as well as our orchestra at St Matthew's.
- ◆ **Mrs Andrea Thomson** (singing and piano) has a B.Mus from NZ School of Music in Wellington. She teaches singing and piano at several Masterton schools and has experience in choral singing, opera and musical theatre.

- ◆ **Mr David Heath** (drums) is a drummer, expert in many styles.
- ◆ **Mr Graeme McArthur** teaching trumpet is well known locally through his work with brass bands and orchestras.
- ◆ **Kathryn Seagrave**, recently arriving from Auckland, is a cello and violin teacher with many years of experience playing in orchestras and teaching at St Cuthbert's.
- ◆ **Sam van Dalen** is a teacher of flute and piano.

Each individual itinerant charges differently, but generally the lessons range from \$25-30 per half-hour lesson.
