Principal's Message



Kia Ora Koutou

You will find a poem I wrote for our term one final school assembly to acknowledge a job almost done.

I wanted to reference a line from that poem, which you will soon enjoy, that reads, 'A journey long, with highs and peaks'. What I am acknowledging is that with all journeys there will be moments of success, joy, or achievement "highs" and "peaks", but also likely some struggles or challenges that make those highs even more significant.

As I reference that, I want to quickly note the significance of the Star metaphor which peppers our communications, sits on blazers, all because our motto is 'Ad Astra Per Aspera'- to the Stars through Endeavour.

Your daughter (or daughters) is a star in your eyes. She always was, from the moment you first dreamed of her, when she was born, and she is today. She will always be that star. For us at school, she truly has 'star qualities'—all bright, shining, and sparkling. But for us, she is also part of a greater constellation. This means she may not necessarily outshine all the other stars, but her unique brightness contributes to the collective glow of St. Matthew's, making us all shine together.

But please know that this is all normal. They will make mistakes, but that is how they learn. Sometimes they may fall down—but they will get back up.

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
