Royal Honours- A Dedication to Dame Catriona Williams



One major feat has been the acknowledgement to an amazing woman, an amazing St Matthew's old girl Catriona Williams (nee McLeod).

Today, with deep pride and heartfelt admiration, we honour one of our own — **Dame Catriona Williams** — for her extraordinary achievement and recent investiture as a Dame Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit.

To see one of our old girls recognised at the highest level for her unwavering courage, advocacy, and contribution to the lives of others is both humbling and inspiring. Dame Catriona's journey has been one marked by resilience, leadership, and a fierce commitment to making a difference — values that lie at the heart of our school.

From her early years within these school gates, Catriona stood out for her passion, determination, and grace. Those of us who knew her then will remember a young woman full of drive and generosity, already embodying the qualities that would later define her public life. Her love for horses, the land, and community was clear even then, and would go on to shape her career as a world-class equestrian and, following her life-changing accident, her tireless advocacy for spinal cord research and accessibility.

What is so powerful about Dame Catriona's story is not just what she has endured, but how she has chosen to respond — with purpose, optimism, and leadership. Founding the CatWalk Trust and championing hope for those with spinal cord injuries has given new life to countless others. She has taken personal tragedy and turned it into collective possibility — and in doing so, has brought honour not only to herself and her family, but to all who have walked through this school.

Dame Catriona, your recognition is richly deserved, and it stands as a shining example to every young woman in our school today. You have shown us what it means to lead with heart, to rise with dignity, and to serve with courage. You remind us that strength is not found in what we can do alone, but in what we inspire others to believe is possible.

We are so proud to call you one of our own. On behalf of our entire school community — students, staff, alumnae, and families — we offer our deepest congratulations and gratitude. Your journey lights a path for generations of young women to follow. There will be school celebration in the immediate future so we can all pay tribute to Dame Catriona.

Teacher Only Day June 3

Thank you for giving space to our Wairarapa wide teacher only day on Tuesday. I took the opportunity to take up the Jase Williams workshops as my foray into the Relational Approaches we will introduce to our school.

As a school dedicated to nurturing the next generation of leaders in business, agriculture, science, and all manner of careers beyond, we are always seeking meaningful and innovative ways to improve our teaching and learning practices. Today, I want to talk to you about a transformative educational philosophy pioneered by Jase Williams at Henry Hill School in Hawke's Bay — one that we believe can deeply enrich the educational journey of our girls aged 11 to 18.

Jase Williams introduced a powerful relational approach to teaching and learning that centres on identity, connection, and shared responsibility. At its heart, this model is about building strong, authentic relationships between students, teachers, whānau (families), and the wider community. It asks us to see each learner as a whole person — with a story, a culture, and a voice that matters.

What makes this approach so relevant for us — a high-performing, resource-rich school — is that it challenges us to look beyond academic outcomes alone. It asks us to reframe success not only in terms of individual achievement but in how we care for one another, how we relate, and how we grow together.

This is especially important in a school like ours, where many of our students come from families involved in areas deeply connected to relationships, sustainability, and long-term thinking. A relational approach aligns beautifully with those values. It invites our girls to learn how to lead with empathy, to communicate across generations and cultures, and to understand that success is built not in isolation but in relationship with others.

Jase Williams' programme at Henry Hill in the Hawkes Bay did not just improve academic results — it transformed school culture. Students felt seen, heard, and valued. Teachers collaborated more deeply. Families became genuine partners in learning. These are the kinds of outcomes we seek as we prepare our young women not just for university or the workforce, but for lives of purpose, leadership, and contribution.

Implementing this approach in our school will mean more than a shift in pedagogy — it will be a shift in mindset. We will reinforce our focus on restorative practices, culturally responsive teaching, and student-led learning. We will make space for voice and identity and ensure every girl in our care feels she belongs, and has the power to lead.

We believe this is not only a model worth adopting, but one that aligns beautifully with our values as a community committed to excellence, sustainability, and leadership. It is especially relevant for a school like ours, with strong roots in farming and business, where relationships and stewardship are foundational principles.

To make this work meaningful and consistent across our school, we understand how essential it will be that our teaching teams engage fully in this journey. This is not just a senior school initiative — it is a whole-school transformation.

By unifying our approach from Years 7 through 13, we can ensure that every student, from their first day with us through to graduation, experiences learning that is grounded in trust, belonging, and purpose. For that reason, we have joined our brother school Rathkeale in ‘signing up’ to this approach.

Our teachers of years 7 and 8 play a pivotal role in laying this foundation. They are the first to help students build confidence, identity, and a sense of belonging in our school. With a relational approach, these early years become even more powerful in shaping self-worth and motivation.

Our teachers of years 9 and beyond carry forward that momentum, equipping our young women with the tools to think critically, lead authentically, and work collaboratively. By embedding relational practices in subject-specific teaching, assessment, and pastoral care, they ensure learning remains relevant, inclusive, and responsive to each girl’s individual journey.

Together, our teaching teams — across year levels and disciplines — will focus on culturally sustaining practices, student voice, whānau partnerships, and restorative ways of working. This means prioritising connection over control, dialogue over discipline, and relationships over routine.

To our students: your relationships matter. Your identity matters. Your voice matters. You are more than your grades — you are future businesswomen, scientists, farmers, creators, and changemakers. And we are here to walk beside you, every step of the way.

Let us honour the values of connection, leadership, and excellence by embracing a relational approach — and shaping a school culture that reflects the very best of who we are and who we can become.

Talofa lava! This week is Samoan Language Week.


Our **Mark of Mission is Tell** and our **School Value is Commitment**.




